



Job Title: Early Childhood Assistant for the 2023-24 academic school year

The primary role of the Early Childhood Assistant is to support the Lead Teacher in bringing the program in a living manner to the children. This requires active participation and understanding of the curriculum to meet the children's needs, as well as close collegial work.

This is a part-time, hourly position.

For qualified applicants, this could be combined with an after school lead teacher position to create a full time position.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Be familiar with Waldorf education,
- At least one-year teaching in an early childhood setting
- Have completed or be willing to complete Waldorf Certification or some Waldorf training
- Strong interpersonal and organizational skills

Preferred Qualifications:

- Fully trained in Waldorf Early Childhood Education and
- Prior experience teaching in a Waldorf Early Childhood setting.
